## GAINOUS TO ADDRESS SSCC GRADUATES

Dr. Fred Gainous, chancellor of the Alabama College System, will be the keynote speaker for Shelton State Community College's annual commencement exercises scheduled for Thursday, May 25, at 7 p.m. at the Bama Theatre.

Dr. Gainous, who was named chancellor of Alabama's two year colleges in March 1988, was associated vice president of St. Petersburg Junior College in Florida before coming to Alabama.

He has also served as assistant commissioner for community colleges and vocational education with the Kansas State Department of Education as well as coordinator of occupational programs and educational information center project director with the Florida State Department of Education.

Dr. Gainous holds a doctorate of education degree and an education specialist degree in curriculum and instruction. He also received a master's degree from the University of Florida in 1972 and a bachelor's degree from Florida A&M University in 1969.

A reception honoring graduates as well as the faculty and staff of the college will be held at the parish Hall of Christ Episcopal Church prior to the graduation exercises.

Over 450 graduates from the college will receive diplomas.

## CARLSON NAMED LEO SUMNER AWARD RECIPIENT

DIANA CARLSON, daughter of Robert and Mary Carlson of Tuscaloosa, was named the 1989 recipient of the Leo Sumner Award, the highest honor bestowed on a student at Shelton State Community College.

The announcement came during Shelton's annual Honors Night ceremony held this past weekend.

Ms. Carlson leaves Shelton with a perfect 4.0 average and will attend the University of Alabama in the fall on a Junior College Honors Scholarship. Rosa Kortright also leaves Shelton with a 4.0 average and has received a Junior College Honors Scholarship.

Kim Holmes was the recipient of the Belinda Hughes Memorial Scholarship given each year. This award was established by Shelton's support staff several years ago in memory of Belinda Hughes.

Senior Studies student Mabel Harries received the James B. Allen Award that is given annually to an outstanding student in each of Alabama's two-year colleges. Mrs. Harries was recognized for her "standard of academic excellence" and her "dedication and joy in the lifelong pursuit of learning."
